Description of Volunteer Duties

Cart Driver: Will be assigned a tee time to drive a cart for a group of three (3) FUTURES Professionals. Their bags will be placed on the back of the cart and also in the passenger seat. You are not a caddie, but will keep an *unofficial* score for the three players which will be taken from you at the turn and posted on the scoreboard.

Scoring: You will be interacting closely with: players, spectators, and media. Volunteers needed include: Nine Hole Scoring, Scoring Tent Scorecard Verifiers, and Scoreboard Recorders, Main and On-Course Leader board and Real Time Scoring. Scoring volunteers need to be accurate and quick and able to work with hand held radios.

Marshals: Help with gallery control and safety is crucial. FUTURES Professionals should not be allowed to make a stroke until everybody is out of range and well back from the field of play. Every reasonable effort should be made to prevent outside agencies from interfering with a balls lie or movement and to locate errant shots to the best of your ability.

Timing: Your main responsibility is to assist the rules officials in spotting "Gaps" in play. A "Gap" in play is defined as anytime a group finishes a hole 12 minutes or more behind the previous group. If a group is 14 minutes or more behind, you will radio a rules official, following the procedure to be given to you at the volunteer meeting.

Media: Will assist the FUTURES Tour Communications Director in taking the media on the course to the players they want to see and help the media find the players they wish to interview.

Housing: We are looking for several families to open their homes to women golfers of the FUTURES Golf Tour. Housing hosts have the unique opportunity to get to know players on a personal level. You will also be providing a great service to the players, allowing them to save on weekly expenses, as well as giving them a comfortable home environment as they travel each week.

Pro-Am: Assist with registration and passing out 'Goodie Bags' to Pro-Am Participants and helping with the Pro-Am Awards Ceremony. Spotters assisting with stocking of refreshments

First Aid: We will have an ambulance service on the premises, but need volunteers in case players need to be shuttled to the First Aid area or need a bandage, etc. taken to them while they are playing.

Driving Range: Help distribute range balls and display name plates behind where the player is practicing to identify her to spectators.

Standard Bearer: Must be able to walk the 18 holes and carry the standard (weight is about 10 pounds). They should also be able to operate a radio and be golf knowledgeable as they will have to be keeping a score and calculating if the player is over or under par.
